What kind of dogs need foster care?

- Pregnant dogs
- Puppies
- Senior dogs
- Mothers with nursing litters
- Dogs with injuries or medical issues
- Special needs fosters
- Rescues from High Kill shelters

Can I become a foster volunteer if I have pets of my own?

Yes, we welcome pet owners as foster volunteers. Please keep in mind that there is always a health risk when exposing your pets to other animals. However, the risk is minimal if your pets are vaccinated and in good health.

How long do dogs need to stay in foster care?

The typical foster stay is two weeks to four weeks, depending on transport schedules. The time frame of each foster situation will be discussed with you ahead of time.

What expenses are involved with foster care?

Foster families provide housing, food, bedding and toys for the dogs in their care. They must be able to transport them to vet appointments. We provide all medical care, including vaccinations and medications.
